

Director Christian Education

Dear Concordians:

At the time of writing, we have eight children signed up for Vacation Bible School on June 14-18. VBS is exactly one month away and it's hard to have all the answers with how flexible we need to be this year. It's easy to look at the registration numbers and be discouraged since we usually have at least double to triple that number of registrations by now. However, it's not all about the numbers.

In Matthew 25:14-30, Jesus tells the parable of the talents. The man gives each of his servants a different amount of money to manage. Two of the servants double the money and the last one only brings back what the master originally gave him, not even earning interest on the money. While we all know people and money are not the same things and there does seem to be a great emphasis on the numbers; there is a greater point of being faithful with what is given. The man who had five talents ended up with eleven (he doubled the five and ended up with the one from the fearful servant) and the man who is given two talents ends up with four. The two servants who were faithful with what they had were given more.

This is not a guarantee that we will end up

with more people, money, children, etc. at our church. However, we are to be good stewards of all the gifts God gives us. This means to love and teach all the children at VBS about Jesus. It doesn't matter if it's eight, eighty, or eight hundred. We will do our best to be good stewards of the time, children, and message God has given us. It doesn't matter if we volunteer at VBS or not, we are all to be good stewards of the gifts God gives us and especially the Gospel message.

As a Christian, we are all called into faith and given the message to make disciples of all nations. God gives us the Gospel message to share with others. The Holy Spirit works through that Word of God to call people to faith and repentance. In all of our vocations,



we can share this God given hope and forgiveness in our Savior's death and resurrection. Be faithful with this abundant gift and be a good steward of all of the blessings God gives.

From your Pastor

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I give thanks to God for our congregation. We have been able to steadily move forward this past year. Our attendance has gradually increased. We confirmed four 8th grade catechumens this past month, and were able to have their families in attendance. That Sunday pushed the boundaries of how many people we could fit in our sanctuary in good conscience, and yet we were able to adapt and make it work out fine.

I'm encouraging our leaders to continue to gently push towards "normalcy", with the emphasis being on gentleness. For example, the question of masks. I think most were surprised by the CDC's new guidelines lessening the requirements for masks. While it is good that our COVID requirements begin to lessen here at Concordia, please be considerate of those who are still at-risk, uncer-

tain, or simply afraid. We'll continue to preach to our people to follow their conscience, use their Christian freedom, and be considerate of others. We may never see masks go away entirely, and regardless of vaccination and immunity rates, I encourage those who desire to use them to continue using them.

But it's also time to begin meeting again. We first emphasized meeting for worship, as receiving from God in the Divine Service should be our priority and focus. But it's also time to begin meeting for other education, service, and social functions. We were created to be a people that come together. Some will not be able to, but for those who are, we should make a point of gathering for all sorts of things as a congregation.

Please keep an eye on our weekly Sunday announcements, website updates, and our monthly newsletter for various social events coming up. We'll soon be having VBS, we have some outdoor evening get-togethers planned, and some bible studies and classes going. I'm in the process of coordinating with Pastor Shadday and St. Paul's Lutheran to host a video watch series from *Answers in Genesis*. These classes will deal with various questions relating to creation, secular science, and the scriptures. Look for more updates and info on this soon, the classes will likely begin in July.
