The Great Commission of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, commands us to reach out to all at home and abroad. Saint Paul writes in Romans 10:17, faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ. Multimedia Gospel outreach materials in multiple Burmese languages made available on a website will enable many Buddhist and Muslim Burmese to hear about the saving love of Jesus in languages that they can easily understand. The Lutheran Agency for Missions to Burmese (LAMB) Board was aware of this need and voted approval but could not finance the cost.

Last quarter collections added up to just over \$100, lets see if we can brake that amount this time.

Lutheran World Relief

In last month's Newsletter, an article referred to plans to receive kits and quilts for LWR. This article should explain why we are doing this.

For many years, churches have put together kits and quilts following directions and requirements in the participant's guide. Once a year, we delivered filled boxes to a drop-off spot in Fort Wayne, the closest drop-off point in Indiana and surrounding states. The ingathering was held during a three-hour time frame on a Saturday with first-come, firstserved to load the truck. If the truck was full, you ended up returning home with what could not be put on the truck and had to wait for another truck to be scheduled. Since Indiana has only two ingathering sites (Fort Wayne and Valparaiso), offering a site in central Indiana would be a service to churches in southern Indiana and northern Kentucky as it would cut their drive time in half.

Several of us contacted the LWR event coordinator and asked if we could serve as an ingathering site. As a result, we asked and received permission from the Directorate and the Board of Operations to host a tractor/trailer to load LWR items. In addition, during the week before pickup, organizations from farther away may, by appointment only, deliver their kits for storage in the Fellowship Hall. These kits will be loaded onto the truck on Saturday morning with the help of volunteers.

Again the date for the LWR pickup is Saturday, September 25, between 8 and 11 am.

We're Gathering School Supplies for Lutheran World Relief

Each school kit contains four note-books, a ruler, blunt scissors, one pencil sharpener, five unsharpened #2 pencils, five black or blue ballpoint pens, one box of 16 or 24 crayons, and one 2-1/2" eraser. Please consider helping when back-to-school sales begin in July and August. Often notebooks are priced at 25 cents each with corresponding sale prices for the other items.

With the help of a Thrivent Action
Team grant, we will purchase the backpacks
to hold the school supplies. Stop by the LWCC
bulletin board and pick a tag for the items you
plan to buy for this project. Leave the school
supplies in the designated bins in the Noah
Room. Can we fill 20 backpacks by Sept. 25?

I'm writing this during Vacation Bible School week and I'm overwhelmed with how many loving and talented volunteers we have. These are volunteers who love Jesus and love the children in our congregation and community. Usually the first day of VBS is chaotic as we get into the swing of things but calms down within 45 minutes as everyone gets back into the groove of things. This year, I was expecting everything to be a really rough first day. I expected classes and volunteers needing to be moved around the first 10 minutes of VBS. I expected lots of questions and complaints of not knowing where the stations were located after being outside. I expected complaints of things being too hot, kids being overheated, and people getting sunburned. To put it simply, I expected the worst.



However, God provides! Some of our Senior Prayer Warriors must have been praying really hard for us during VBS because we had PERFECT weather on Monday. It made everything bearable and made me feel like it was a good decision to

be outside. The volunteers caught on quickly where everything was and were great leaders for the children. God sent us a little over 20 kids on the first day and blessed us with enough volunteers that we weren't overwhelmed with our situation.

God used our volunteers to teach children about how God leads the way for us. We learned about Noah, the 10 Commandments, Jesus calling disciples, Jesus healing the 10 lepers, and Jesus forgiving Peter.

It can be hard knowing where to go or what to do. All of VBS planning this year felt that way. What was the best way to host VBS this year and teach children about Jesus and still

keep them safe? God does not provide those exact answers in the Bible. If He did, someone should have shown it to me months ago. God does provide His True and loving Word to guide us. He gives us things like the 10 Commandments, God's moral law, to help guide us. We see the life of Jesus and learn how he seriously meant we were to be perfect as He is perfect. We see the sacrifice Jesus made for our sins as He died on the cross and rose again. We read the epistles (letters) to the early churches and learn how we are to act in regards to God and one another. God gives us so much guidance and leadership to apply to our lives. Most importantly, God leads us back to Him through Jesus.

Thanks be to God for all the things He has done for us! Thanks be to God that we can use our God given talent to glorify Him! Thank you God for all of the wonderful children and volunteers You gave us during VBS. Thank you for their wonderful faith, gifts, talents, and love for their congregation and community. Thank you for all those who helped VBS by praying, donating items, and volunteering to help. Thank you for our Pastor who guides us and teaches us about You. Thank you for providing for us and guiding us through Your Word and Sacrament. In Jesus' name, Amen.
