Lecture Tour by Bishop Juhana Pohjola in for Wayne, IN on November 13, 2021 (9:30 am) at St Paul's Lutheran church.

On August 1, 2021, Rev. Dr. Juhana Pohjola was consecrated Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Mission Diocese of Finland. He enters the role at a challenging time: Bishop Pohjola faces criminal charges in Finland for his role in publishing a 2004 booklet which articulates historic Christian teaching on human sexuality.

Should it be illegal to identify homosexual activity as sinful? That's the question facing Bishop Pohjola now, seventeen years after the booklet was first published. He and the booklet's author, Dr. Paivi Rasanen (a Finnish Member of Parliament), have been charged by Finland's Prosecutor General with "incitement against a group of people."

What can we learn from Bishop Pohjola's story? How should we respond to a world that is increasingly intolerant of Christian beliefs? And what does Scripture have to say to us about being persecuted on account of our faith in Christ? Come hear Bishop Pohjola in person to find out.

Thirst to Learn: Bible Books for Africa's Children—Lutheran Heritage Foundation—\$100,000

Lutheran Heritage Foundation continues its work of translating, publishing, distributing, and introducing Lutheran materials throughout Africa where the population is more than 1.216 billion people. African families face many physical and spiritual challenges, including ex-

treme poverty, disease, civil unrest, and the ever-growing presence of Islam. Sadly, over half those souls are still waiting to be introduced to the one true Savior, Jesus Christ. Lutheran missionaries and church leaders in Africa have witnessed a "thirst to learn" about the Savior and have expressed a deep need for easy-to-understand Lutheran books, printed in the languages of the people, to teach parents and children the Lutheran faith. African Lutheran partner churches also need engaging, colorful books to introduce children to Jesus in their Lutheran schools, Sunday schools, and orphanages — books the children may keep for their very own. Lutheran Heritage Foundation has 30 years of vigorously fulfilling its mission of translating and publishing highquality Lutheran books for children, such as A Child's Garden of Bible Stories, Luther's Small Catechism, and Bible Stories in Pictures into the languages of the world at a cost of less than \$3 per book. Economic and political conditions may force missionaries to leave a country, but the Lutheran books they leave behind stay — and teach — for generations. This grant will fund the printing and distribution of 129,500 engaging, colorful books which will introduce children to Jesus in their Lutheran schools, Sunday schools, and orphanages.



In countries where the typical child doesn't own a single book of his or her own, a book



about Jesus makes a big impact! In addition to family devotions, the books are a cherished gift to impoverished Lutheran schools. In addition to serving as textbooks for religion class, the Bible storybooks and catechisms are also used in some countries as reading and literacy texts!

More than 400 million children live in Africa, nearly half of whom live in the spiritual darkness of Islam.



Can you imagine being responsible for teaching the Bible to a class of eager students, week after week, with absolutely no written materials to do so? For generations, this has been the situation for many Sunday school teachers throughout Africa. With this grant, Sunday school teachers will now have Bible storybooks and Small Catechisms, translated into languages they speak and read.

Director Christian Education

Greetings.

We just studied Joseph in Sunday School. I enjoy Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat because the movie has funny moments in it. One of my favorites is when Pharaoh is singing to Joseph about his dream. Joseph asks Pharaoh to repeat a part he just sang while Joseph goes over to the Narrator and consults the Bible.

Poor, poor Joseph didn't have the easiest life. One of the memorable parts of Joseph's life is how he goes from being in prison to second in command for all of Egypt. God worked through Joseph to save Egypt and eventually all of Joseph's family and their servants. Joseph's "prison life" wasn't the worst. Someone recognized Joseph's talent for administration and put him in charge of all the prisoners. They didn't worry about those under Joseph's care. Through God, Joseph eventually interprets the dreams of the chief cupbearer and chief baker. Joseph asks the chief cupbearer to remember him, but the chief cupbearer forgets Joseph until Pharaoh has his dreams two years later.

It is hard being patient. Especially in unfair situations, it is hard to be patient. Joseph was sold against his will to be a slave in Egypt. He still served God and did his best in everything. He was falsely accused and sent to prison. He still served God and did his best in everything. He had a glimmer of hope. The cupbearer, who served Pharaoh, could vouch for Joseph. The cupbearer could explain Joseph was forcibly carried off from the land of the Hebrews and that he's done nothing to deserve being in prison. Pharaoh could free Joseph.

Instead, Joseph's salvation came from God. Pharaoh didn't free Joseph because he was unfairly treated. Instead, God worked through Joseph. Reading through Joseph's conversation with Pharaoh and recognizing that when Joseph speaks about God he is using words to reference the One True God. Thankfully, Pharaoh didn't get too offended because Pharaoh was considered a God in Egypt. Joseph often emphasizes these are things God is saying or revealing. Pharaoh even acknowledges that since this is what God revealed to Joseph, Joseph should be second in command.



God did all of the work and Joseph gives glory to God. In our salvation story, God does all the work. Jesus is the one that came to earth. Jesus lived a perfect life. Jesus was unfairly put on trial, tortured, and murdered. Jesus is the one who rose from the

dead. Jesus ascended into heaven. The Holy Spirit calls us by the Gospel. God puts His name on us in Holy Baptism. God sustains us with His gifts. God is the one who saves us. There are many ways to react to God's love, but we know He loves us. Even when times are hard or when we feel forgotten; God loves us. If we ever forget, we can go back and consult God's Word and see how much He loves and cares for us.


