Hope of Christ for Cancer Pa-

tients—Phil's Friends—\$70,000

Phil Zielke started Phil's Friends after battling cancer twice in his mid-twenties. Phil had Christ in his heart, and the care items and notes of Christian encouragement received from family and friends gave him hope and made him realize many did not have that hope. When he recovered, he made it his mission to provide hope to cancer patients. Phil's Friends, a full-time ministry, began in 2009.

Care packages contain a Bible, blanket, hat, socks, lip balm, toothpaste, toothbrush, lotion, journal, pen, puzzle book, and playing cards. Also included is a Gospel message explaining how our "hope" comes from our relationship with our Lord. When someone is battling cancer, it is so important to know of the unending love of Jesus. With these grant funds, Phil's Friends will provide 1,000 cancer patients with the hope and encouragement that

only Jesus can bring.

After the person with cancer receives their care package, they receive a Card of Hope for 12 consecutive months. These cards are colorfully decorated and contain a Bible

verse and an uplifting message from a Phil's Friends volunteer. The recipient knows that someone is still thinking about them and praying for them.

The care package recipients receive so much joy from receiving the package. They know that a group of individuals who made the care package has just shown them unconditional love. Showing unconditional love opens the door for Phil's Friends to share the Gospel message and God's Word.

Phil's Friends volunteers colorfully decorate care packages. They are sent anonymously and provide an emotional uplift when received by the person with cancer.



Last November, the LWCC decided to ask the congregation to help Afghanistan children at Camp Atterbury. We planned to ask for monetary donations in February. Since then, we've learned that many families have resettled in Indianapolis and other areas. There is no longer a need at Camp Atterbury. A local group, "Exodus Refugee.org," is helping the Afghanistan families establish a new life in Indiana. We plan to collect monetary gifts this February. For example, a \$25 donation can purchase a \$25 English picture dictionary, or \$100 can provide uniforms and supplies for one child. We'll combine all gifts, large and small, at the end of February and send them to Exodus Refugee, who can purchase and distribute whatever our contributions will provide. From your Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I pray that you all had a good Christmas season. For many this was a much more pleasant holiday season than last year. We had strong attendance at our Christmas Eve and Day services, as well as New Years. But I know some of you are still very much at-risk and isolated with Covid, and so I keep you especially in my prayers.

In this newsletter article I'll touch on two different subjects:

Lent Schedule

I have discussed with the Board of Pastoral Care ways to reduce my workload with the number of services we are offering. It was agreeable that the best place to cut back are our upcoming Lenten Midweek Services. For Ash Wednesday, we will still offer services at 4:00 and 7:00 PM, based on strong past attendance for that service.

However, for the following Wednesday midweek services in Lent, and as well as for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, we will have only 1 service at 7:00 PM. We encourage all those who cannot attend a later service to make use of our livestream. I know this will be a disappointment for some, but it was not a decision made lightly. We felt it was important to free up more of my time and energy for other necessary pastoral duties, especially visitation.

Our Easter service schedule is still being discussed and will be shared in later announcements.

"...And explain everything in the kindest way"

Luther says these words in his explanation of the 8th commandment, that we should not bear false testimony against each other. Instead, we ought to *explain every*-

thing in the kindest way. We commonly call this "putting the best construction" on something.

The world teaches us the opposite. We love to tear each other apart through our words, putting the worst spin on what someone says. You see this in the news, especially in politics, but also online with the likes of Facebook and Twitter. We regularly put the worst construction on what people say, and explain things in the most *unkind* ways.

That's the way of the world. It should not be the way for us Christians. Consider how God can show his grace through how his Church lives. We should be patient in our reactions, not twisting other's words, seeking to understand what they really mean to say and where they are coming from. This doesn't mean we have to sugarcoat everything; we can call things as they are and disagree, but we can do so in the kindest and most helpful way.

Don't let negative news programs and articles make you bitter. Put the best construction on everything our president, governors, and local politicians say, even and especially when you don't agree with it! It's not always easy...but it's what we're called to do.

Social Media is a breeding ground for nasty speech and comments. Don't fall for it. Be careful and aware of what you post, whether it's original content, or if you are commenting on someone else' post. Jesus taught us to love our neighbor as ourselves. If you wouldn't want someone twisting your words into what you didn't mean to say, then don't do it to others! Strive to understand where others are coming from when you don't agree with them.

Our God does not put the worst construction on us, but sees us as his children, redeemed by Jesus' blood, and not just as the disobedient sinners we are. We should strive to see each other that way too.

My mom tells a story of me as a preschool, swinging in our backyard and singing loudly (and off key, I'm sure): "Oh victory in Jesus, my Savior forever. He socked me and bopped me with his redeeming blood." Though that isn't an example of how to effectively share Jesus with your neighbors, the mistaken words might contain a nugget of truth.

In 1939, a stroke partially paralyzed hymn writer Eugene Bartlett. Bedridden and unable to perform anymore, he penned his final, most beloved song, "Victory in Jesus." The actual lyrics read: "O victory in Jesus, my Savior forever. He sought me and bought me with his redeeming blood."

It's beautiful to realize that Jesus did indeed seek me out and pay the ultimate price for me. But sometimes I forget - and that's when he "socks me" and "bops me." Jesus loves me too much to let life's chaos and struggles distract me from him and what he's done. Let's all remember to celebrate our victory in Jesus!
