PRELUDE

THE PROCESSIONAL

INVOCATION

- P: In the name of the Father, and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM

- P: In Holy Baptism, **Nancy** was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all of her sins. St. Paul says: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?"
- C: We were buried therefore with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His.

- C: Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.
- P: You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup runs over.
- C: Surely goodness and mercy will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord. Forever.

FIRST READING Isaiah 25: 6-9

On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well aged wine, of rich food full of marrow, of aged wine well refined. And he will swallow up on this mountain the covering that is cast over all peoples, the veil that is spread over all nations. He will swallow up death forever; and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces, and the reproach of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. It will be said on that day, "Behold, this is our God; we have waited for him, that he might save us. This is the Lord; we have waited for him; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation."

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 15: 45-49

Thus it is written, "The first man Adam became a living being", the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. But it is not the spiritual that is first but the natural, and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. As was the man of dust, so also are those who are of the dust, and as is the man of heaven, so also are those who are of heaven. Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we shall also bear the image of the man of heaven.

THIRD READING John 14: 1-6

"Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. And you know the way to where I am going." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

APOSTLE'S CREED
