Dear Members:

Sunday, September 11th is our Rally Day and the church picnic. It's embarrassing to admit, but Covid shut downs really got me off track on when we give out materials to different age levels. However, there is a bright side! Pastor and I were able to talk about beneficial resources for families and talk about when we could give them to families. Rally Day is when we are going to pray for the families receiving the resources and give them some help learning how to use the resources.

There is a book called *God's Own Child*, *I Gladly Say It* that we would like to give to each child at baptism. This is a good reminder of what our baptism is and what God does



for us. We would also like to give each family a copy of *Luther's Small Catechism for Kids*. This is a newer resource that covers the catechism and turns it more into a

devotional or short family lesson. We would like to get this catechism into the hands of parents so they can start reading the catechism with their children and get in the habit of family devotions.

We also are going to rotate giving our 3-5 year olds two different resources. This is based on the two different years kids could potentially be in our Preschool. This year, we will give the children the *Read with Me Bible*. We will use this Bible in the Preschool to guide our religion curricula in Preschool. We will send these Bibles home with the children (rather than give them as a graduation gift) so families can read the same Biblical accounts at home and start getting into the habit of reading the Bible at an early age. The second year will be CPH's *My First Hymnal*. We will use hymns from this hymnal to sing with the children. Parents can also use the hymnal for devotional materials or to learn hymns in the home.

The final resource we will give children at a young age is *The Growing in Faith Bible*. This Bible is a wonderful resource from CPH. It is an ESV (English Standard Version) translation which is what we use at church, so they'll hear the same language in their home Bible and at church. There are also wonderful features like parent connections, summaries of Biblical narratives, "Christ Connections" (showing where the Old Testament is pointing to Jesus), Big Questions/Answers, and more. Children should be able to grow into this Bible for many years and parents can look to it as a helpful resource.

We thank God we'll be able to share these resources with families and hope everyone will celebrate with the children that day. We also hope everyone will come and enjoy spending time with each other at the church picnic. I know sometimes it's nice to just have a good potluck meal, even better desserts, and a time to sit and talk with people.

Gospel Outreach to Women and Children in Mongolia – Lu-

theran Hour Ministries – \$100,000 Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) has an opportunity to expand its mission outreach of the Gospel to the Kazakh women and children in Mongolia, a non-Christian country. The Kazakh people are nominally Muslim, and Mongolia is predominantly Buddhist with a less than one percent Christian population. The Gospel will impact family members and relatives in their homes through widely-accepted Women's Listener groups, religious broadcasts, and Christian resources in the Kazakh language. Through LHM's media expertise, they can bring the Gospel message to regions where the populations have not heard the Gospel. Christian resources are being distributed, including Bible studies and booklets translated into the Kazakh language, as well as into Mongolian, the primary language of the region.
