**Spiritual and Physical Food for Children of Peru** – La Mision Luterana del Peru – \$56,750

Castillo Fuerte (Mighty Fortress) Mercy House is an outreach of the LCMS Missions in Latin America and the Caribbean and was started in 2013. Lima's people cannot fully finance the work of the Mercy House and the work of our missionaries, who feed the souls with the Word of God and show the love of Christ by feeding the parents and children's stomachs. Families come to receive food for their physical bodies, and they stay because of Jesus' love for them as He feeds them the spiritual food which sustains their souls. The healing power of Christ's love and redemption shines into the broken lives of the families, making them whole. This grant would partner with La Mision Luterana and Castillo Fuerte to work together to care for the children and families of Lima, Peru, by providing for the needs of the body and soul.



Children receive a healthy, well-balanced, hot meal at the Mercy House daily. For some of these children, this is the only meal they will have all day. After this nourishing meal for the body, they gather to hear the Word and have their souls fed.

Children head home alone through the streets of Lima, the capital city of Peru. In this city of over 10 million people, children often find themselves alone while parents work 12-hour days to provide enough money to keep the family fed and out of poverty. Children are left



to look out for each other against the dangers of the city: the dark streets, thieves, gangs, drugs, and predators of all types. Castillo Fuerte serves these vulnerable children by providing a safe space away from these dangers while caring for both body and soul.

Large Grant #4 (LWML Indiana District Convention 2022) **Lutheran Braille Workers** – \$10,000 The mission of Lutheran Braille Workers is to provide the message of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ to people who are blind or visually impaired throughout the world for *free*.

Almost 241 million people worldwide are blind or visually impaired and unchurched (equivalent to the 5th most-populated country in the world). Yet, LBW is the *only* Lutheran organization that intentionally serves this population in the United States and across all continents. LBW is the world's largest nonprofit producer of Braille, Specialized Large Print, and Audio Christian materials.

LBW has over 3,000 volunteers throughout 115 Ministry Production Centers and 50 Ministry Outreach Centers in the United States dedicated to sharing the Gospel with people who are blind or visually impaired and assisting in the production of over 200,000 volumes of material annually.

LBW has six Ministry Production Centers in Indiana, producing thousands of volumes of Braille and Specialized Large Print Christian materials. Hundreds of thousands of people know the true Light of Jesus in their lives through these materials.

This \$10,000 grant will fund the production of over 2,000 Braille, Specialized Large Print or Audio volumes.

## Director Christian Education

Dear Members:

The youth had their Christmas Party early in December. They were sly enough to get me off topic during the Bible Study, but it's something I enjoy talking about because it doesn't come up often. In 2011, I went on an archeological dig in Hippos (Sussita), Israel. It was with Mark Schuler at Concordia St. Paul and part of the Northeast Insula Project. This city was destroyed by an earthquake. However, there is some archeological evidence that this could be the "city on the hill" Jesus referred to and the place where Jesus sent the demons into the pigs.

The kibbutz (communal farm) we stayed at was on the Sea of Galilee. On dig days, we would load the bus while it was dark and ride part way to the dig site and walk the rest of the way. There was an Israeli team (University of Haifa) and American



team the year I was there. To get to the dig site, we actually crossed into Syria and came back to Israel.

It was fun learning how an archeological dig worked with my five-person team. It was also surprising

to find out that sometimes we got to throw rocks off the side of the cliff. Whenever that happened, our team would gather to the side to see where it would go/what it would do. It was usually large chunks of basalt or limestone. The basalt was cool because it would make the loudest noises and sometimes take things with it. The limestone was cool because if it would hit something, it would explode into other rocks. The farmers called dig season, "Bowling for Bovines."

It's really fun the first few days digging because the dig sites always find "pottery." It's fun to put in the bucket and frustrating when the veteran diggers would tell you to, "Get it out, it's not big enough." It's your first day of finding things and the biggest pottery you've found so it makes no sense. Once you left the dig site and have lunch though, it makes sense as all the teams scrub through BUCKETS of pottery. Every single piece has to be washed and categorized. That's why the pros only want large pieces or pieces with something interesting (part of a curve, a ridge, or part of a lip).

It's also interesting to note your dig has to stop if anything really interesting is found like a LARGE piece of pottery, multiple bones (that don't look like small animal bones), coins, finding floor to your building, etc. My dig site found an in situ (in place) lintel and we took a break as they did all the categorization and surveying for it.

I could go on about the field trips we got to take in the evenings or even the process or things we found. However, there are people who have put together whole websites on the site itself, so if you're interested, check out the following:

<u>This website</u> has a picture of a well or fountain. My dig site was right next to the it. From what I understand they found this fountain/garden the prior year as they started working ttoward the edge of the cliff.

<u>This is the main website for the excavation</u> <u>project.</u> Under <u>Main Excavation Areas</u>, if you look at the Northeast Church, that's over by where my site was.

#### Dear Saints,

I spent much of December preaching that we should not jump to Christmas early and ignore the waiting season of Advent. It may seem like we're deemphasizing Christmas entirely.

But that's not the case! In the church we just shift back our Christmas Celebrations to their proper place. The secular world starts celebrating Christmas so early that by December 26th, we're already thinking forward to something like Valentine's day. But in the church, December 25th is just the beginning of our Christmas Celebrations. The 12 days of Christmas, which we know so well from the song, are the days following Christmas Day.

These days build up to our Christian Holy Day of Epiphany on January 6th, when it's traditionally understood that the wisemen came to see Jesus and bore their precious gifts. Epiphany means "revealing", referring to the revealing of this baby boy being our God in the flesh. To have gentiles like the magi coming to see Jesus was a revelation that he is the savior and king for all people, not just Jews.

We'll continue our Christmas Celebration with an Epiphany Worship service on Friday, January 6th at 6:30 PM, and will have an informal celebration reception afterward. A great way to reclaim the Christian side of Christmas is to reemphasize our traditional church holy days that have fallen out of favor.
