## Ministry Vehicle Fund, Ethiopia and

**Sierra Leone** – Lutheran Bible Translators – \$70,000

Lutheran Bible Translators (LBT) use literacy programs within the local language communities to give people the skills to read the newly translated Bible, which results in a personal relationship with God. When they can read God's Word in their local or heart language, they know that God speaks their language and hears their prayers. Local personnel in Ethiopia and Sierra Leone, identified as partners with LBT, help teach their people. The long distances between the language communities have treacherous and hazardous terrain. The money from this grant will help purchase robust, reliable vehicles. Trainers will be able to travel to God's people who are waiting for the opportunity to learn to read the saving words of the Gospel in their heart language. Having reliable vehicles will impact multiple language groups in both countries.



Literacy programs funded by Lutheran Bible Translators generally have 400–900 students. As Scripture is translated into the local languages, both the young and old need to be taught how to read it.

Showing God's Love in the International District, Albuquerque, New Mexico – God Cares About You Mission – \$98,000 Albuquerque's International District is home to an ethnically diverse and disadvantaged population with a high crime rate. God Cares About You Mission, which nine area Lutheran churches support, is transforming lives now and for eternity. Their outreach includes a clothing bank, children's ministry, food bank, back-to-work program, Christian fellowship, meals, Bible studies, worship services, street evangelism, and counseling. With outreach only offered three days a week, the desire is to provide it six days. With this expansion, they need to add a services director and kitchen manager to manage better the programs offered. This grant will help with salaries. With the funds from this grant, God Cares About You can expand their ministry and reach more with Christ's love.



This is the "God Cares About You" food distribution in which people get large boxes of food and everyone picks what they want.

### Both grants have received total funding! We are thankful for what our mission mites are accomplishing.

Large Grant #9 (LWML Indiana District Convention 2022) **St John's Lutheran Church, Rochester, IN** – *Celebrate Recovery* – \$7,300 There are no faith-based addiction support programs in Fulton County. Seventy percent of participants in *Celebrate Recovery*, an addiction and homeless program, are unchurched, and interaction and group fellowship help participants grow emotionally and spiritually. The funds from this grant will continue the program of addiction support.

## Where did LWR Quilts & Kits go in 2022?

Concordia Lutheran Preschool

May and June are exciting months for Preschool. Concordia's support allows us to have some wonderful ministry moments and time to connect with our Preschool families. There were some days when we had a few PreK students and their families stay after school to have picnics on the lawn and let their kids play together. This family ended up enrolling in our Preschool.

We trust God continues to grow those seeds of faith throughout the child's entire life.

We are also excited to see many of our students return to Concordia for Vacation Bible School in June. ### "Thy Kingdom Come": Building God's Eternal Kingdom Right Now

In the 40 days after Jesus rose from the dead and before he ascended into Heaven to the Father's right hand, he spoke to the disciples about the kingdom of God (Acts 1). The disciples asked if Jesus was going to finally restore the Kingdom to Israel. We can imagine they had an earthly kingdom in mind, something that would rival the great Roman Empire.

Jesus responded: "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." He then ascended to heaven. Jesus was sending them to bring his Kingdom and Reign into and all around this world. We often think of Kingdoms simply as land, but more specifically it is where a monarch has authority. Where a king's people go, especially when they are sent out with his authority, the kingdom and reign goes with them.

This is what Jesus is doing with his disciples: sending them out with authority to preach the Gospel, forgive sins in Jesus' name, to baptize, all of this to further and grow Jesus' Kingdom.

Consider how Luther taught about "thy kingdom come" in his small catechism:

What does this mean? The kingdom of God certainly comes by itself without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may come to us also.

How does God's kingdom come? God's kingdom comes when our heavenly Father gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity.

This work continues for us in the Church today. God is working through us to build his eternal kingdom now! Certainly we're still waiting for the Last Day, when we're gathered out of this sinful world into the perfect paradise of God's Eternal Kingdom. But we enjoy the fact that even now we have this inheritance to look forward to, we are made members of God's royal family right now.

While on earth, our churches aren't perfect. Our congregations, our leadership, our staff, our pastors are far from perfect. But when we are doing his work as the church, gathering in his name, hearing his word and receiving his sacraments, and carrying out works of mercy in his name, then we are helping establish his perfect kingdom despite our imperfection. He does not leave us alone in this task, as we would surely fail, but he guides us by the Holy Spirit.

Let us do our work of serving God's Kingdom here in our congregation with humble spirits that trust in God. Let us repent of all sins, let us be guided by God's Word, strengthened by his Holy Spirit, and let us work with courage that God can and will build his kingdom through us.
