Reaching the Homebound with God's Word – Lutheran Ministries Media, Inc. (DBA Worship Anew) – \$100,000

Lutheran Ministries Media reaches the home-bound and aging with the life-saving message of the Gospel through the weekly broadcast ministry of Worship Anew. With an aging population, the need exists for access to faithful teaching and understanding of the Bible as taught in our creeds and Lutheran confessions. The broadcast currently reaches areas of New York, Georgia, Indiana, Michigan, Illinois, and Iowa. Lutheran Ministries Media wants to expand its broadcast area by securing on-the-air broadcast time on a new nationwide station and enhancing its online presence. The grant funds will pay the broadcast fees and the internet expansion.

New camera equipment has recently been installed and used in production, starting with the April 5, 2020, Palm Sunday program. All recordings of Worship Anew take place in a state-of-the-art media center on the campus of Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne.



Missionaries to America Project – Mission Nation Publishing – \$88,000

People from all corners of the world populate the United States. Mission Nation's "Missionaries to America" project aims to help the LCMS strengthen its capacity to share Jesus with people with whom we may be unable to relate because of cultural and language barriers. With this grant, Mission Nation Publishing will be able to provide opportunities and resources for each of us to be better witnesses for Jesus to ethnic groups other than our own through the publication of the stories of missionaries, who now reside in the United States, and their respective faith journeys.

Missionary to America, Gagan Gurung spent 22 years in a refugee camp in Nepal. His family was forced to leave Bhutan because of ethnic prejudice. While there, a former Hindu priest turned Christian evangelist tried to

bring Gagan to Christ, but he ran away, hiding in a Hindu temple in the mountains. He came to Christ after a miracle in his life. Today he is a missionary in St. Louis, bringing more than fifty Nepalese refugees to baptism at Timothy and Ascension Lutheran Churches.
