Orphan Grain Train Servant Center

— Orphan Grain Train, U.S. — \$100,000

Orphan Grain Train (OGT) has carried out the mission of the Lord for thirty years by providing humanitarian service. They work through the church, so the Gospel always accompanies their service. They have assisted orphans, carried out domestic disaster relief, and gathered, sorted, packed, and distributed food, clothing, medical supplies, equipment, and educational materials for those experiencing poverty in the U.S. and internationally.

The original Norfolk, Nebraska facility is outdated and lacks adequate space for expanding work. They need to build an additional facility to increase their mission capacity and increase the safety level for volunteers. With an increased work area, larger groups of volunteers can work on donations received, and the output of mercy meals can double to 10,000,000 meals annually. This grant will help OGT complete its building project.

OGT now owns the whole block except for the grain silos. The old warehouse is to the left of the silos, and the whole building wraps around the silos. The white pitched roof toward the

back of the building is the Mercy Meals renovated building.



Thank you to everyone who donated items, and the needed manpower to put things in order for the Annual Rummage Sale. Items that were not sold were given to Salvation Army and Habitat for Humanity. \$1,432.00 was collected and will be going towards the operations of LWCC. We would like to see more people who are able to help next year.

Sounds like an interesting start to a horror movie or Halloween party, doesn't it? This truly would be horrific. Yet, this is our lives. There is so much evil in the world. It tries to pull us away from God or distract us in our faith. There are many thoughts that would turn our trust from our Savior, just like Peter experienced walking on water. It would seem we would have every reason to be afraid.

"We tremble not, we fear no ill;
They shall not overpow'r us.
This world's prince may still
Scowl fierce as he will,
He can harm us none.
He's judged; the deed is done;
One little word can fell him."

How can we stand alone against the devil, the world, and our sinful nature? We can't. We need Jesus and His saving work. These words come from verse 3 of *A Mighty Fortress Is Our God*. The second verse reminds us that,

"With might of ours can naught be done, Soon were our loss effected; But for us fights the valiant One,"

Jesus Christ, the Lord of Sabaoth (Lord of hosts or Lord of heaven), is the one who fights for us. That is why we need not fear, even with everything that would try and tear us away from our Savior. We have One who is



more powerful than anything in all creation who is on our side. Because of Jesus, we cannot be overpowered. We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

5 For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. 6 We know that our old self[a] was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 7 For one who has died has been set free[b] from sin. 8 *Now if we have died with Christ, we believe* that we will also live with him. 9 We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. 10 For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. 11 So you also must consider vourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus. (Romans 6:4-11)

God holds the field forever. God holds the victory forever. Whenever we doubt who won the war, we simply need to look at the cross and remember who is by our side with His good gifts and Spirit. Our victory has been won.

Pillars of the faith



Because Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses, or thoughts, to a church door in Wittenberg, Germany, on October 31, 1517, many Christians remember that day and the major changes, or

Reformation, that resulted.

Luther's theses contained three main pillars, which have stood for over 500 years:

- Sola Scripture (Scripture Alone) The Bible is the sole authority in matters of faith, life and conduct. "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16, NRSV).
- Sola Fine (Faith Alone) Christians are justified, or declared righteous, only through believing in Jesus Christ as Savior. Although morality and good works are important, they alone cannot lead to salvation. "A person is justified not by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ" (Galatians 2:16, NRSV).
- Sola Gratia (Grace Alone) Grace is God's unmerited, or undeserved, favor. Salvation is a free gift from our gracious God. "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God not the result of works, so that no one may boast" Ephesians 2:8-9, NRSV).


