Despite our differences, challenges, and life experiences, we are all children of God. The mission of Journeys Lutheran School is to serve God's children ages eight to 21 with special needs such as attention deficit disorder, learning disabilities, autism, anxiety, trauma, emotional behavior disorder, and obsessive-compulsive disorder. For 60 years, the school in the Milwaukee area has prepared students to maximize their spiritual, academic, physical, emotional, and social potential to become successful Christian members of society. Students can earn a high school diploma and participate in meaningful cultural, historical, and spiritual events. Enrollment in the high school program is growing. This grant will help purchase two vans to transport high school students enrolled in the School-to-Work Internship Program and students taking elective classes at nearby Martin Luther High School.



The Advent season is a time of waiting. We remember the time before Jesus was born that the people waited for the Savior.

No more separation from God.

Adam and Eve and all the people in the Old Testament, the first part of the Bible, waited for the Savior. Through the Bible, we learn about Jesus, the one from Adam's, Jesse's (King David's father), and King David's lineage would come to save us. How the one born in Bethlehem, the city where David was from, would come save us. How Jesus is the one to fulfill all the prophecies about the Savior.
