Lutheran Theological Seminary, Siberia Russia—Married Student Housing—\$10,000

Professional church workers are necessary for the church to carry out the command of the Great Commission. With this grant, the Siberian Mission Society will update one apartment for a student and his family at the Lutheran Seminary in Novosibirsk, Siberia, Russia.

Expanding God's Love in Uganda—LCMS Office of International Mission, Africa Region – \$92,000

The Lutheran Church of Uganda (LCU) is a steadily growing church body in eastern Africa, which has requested LCMS assistance to locally train deaconesses so they may assist the small number of Lutheran pastors throughout Uganda to teach the faith, provide spiritual care, and show mercy to the communities. Providing local training will significantly benefit qualified women who cannot travel to Kenya for a two-year program and

to the church. This grant would allow for a land purchase attached to the established Lutheran Theological College Uganda, fencing and a small dormitory for the women.



All 150 of the LCU congregations have many children. In a country where half of the population is under eighteen, it is common for at least half of the congregation to be children. There is a strong need for teaching the faith to families throughout Uganda. Ugandans value education and want their children to know *Jesus, and the parents want to be confident in* teaching their children about Jesus correctly. Having Deaconesses dedicated to teaching Christian education would greatly assist the pastors and prepare the next generation for service in the church. Their presence also helps the LCU become more well known in their communities as the mercy work is always connected to Christ through the LCU.

Christ-Centered Materials for Hmong Language School and

Outreach—St. Paul Hmong Outreach Ministries – \$78,364

St. Paul Hmong Outreach Ministries in Merced, California, has been actively involved in outreach to Hmong communities in their native tongue for 15 years. Host churches, St. Paul Lutheran in Merced and Redeemer Lutheran in Fresno, California, are connected to the Hmong Language Schools since their founding in 2015 and 2018. Through the schools and outreach at New Year's festivals, the Gospel is heard, and families are baptized and confirmed. Funds are needed to continue mission programs, develop new training modules, and support training implementation of Christ-centered educational materials in the

Hmong language to be used in the schools, for festival outreach, and to share with other LCMS churches and districts.

Director Christian Education

While doing my research for the Women's Tuesday Night Bible Study, *Meant for Good: A Study of Joseph*, I was at the Indiana District Administrator's Conference and one of the speakers in that conference was talking about Leah.

In Genesis 29, Jacob arrives at Laban's house. Jacob stole his brother Esau's blessing by tricking his blind father. Esau desires to kill Jacob, so his mother tells him to go to her homeland. Upon arriving, Jacob falls in love with Rachel. Jacob agrees to work for 7 years to marry Rachel. The wedding day arrives and Jacob is tricked into marrying Leah. Of course, Jacob isn't happy and another agreement is reached. He is to finish out his week for this marriage and then he can marry the one he loves.

There is more to the story and there are many relationship dynamics. Something the conference speaker pointed out was Leah and her attitude toward having children.

"When the Lord saw that Leah was hated, he opened her womb, but Rachel was

barren. And Leah conceived and bore a son, and she called his name Reuben for she said, "Because the Lord has looked upon my affliction; for now my husband will love me." She conceived again and bore a son, and said, "Because the Lord has heard that I am hated, he

has given me this son also." And she called his name Simeon. Again she conceived and bore a son, and said, "Now this time my husband will be attached to me, because I have borne him three sons." Therefore his name was called Levi. And she conceived again and bore a son, and said, "This time I will praise the Lord." Therefore she called his name Judah. Then she ceased bearing.

The Lord knows Leah is loved less by her husband (if even loved at all). God gives her 4 sons and at least one daughter. Leah was the first to have a child to carry on Jacob's line, yet he still did not love her. Reuben sounds a lot like "Look! A son! And He has seen my misery." God sees her. She was still miserable. She has Simeon "one who hears," God hears her and knows she is unloved by her husband. She has Levi "attached" hoping her husband would be attached to her like she desires him to be. Finally, Judah, "Praise" is born. After these years and children, she is no longer looking for her husband's love and validation through childbearing. It isn't working. Instead, she praises God for what he has done through her. She finds love and validation in her relationship and blessings from God. Judah is the one the Messiah would be descended from. Judah, the fourth (and final) son of the less loved wife.

Like Leah, we sometimes look for love, validation, and identity in the wrong places. We seek it through our jobs, school, hobbies, clubs, teams, sports, relationships, knowledge, health, status, possessions, or other things. We often forget our true identity as a Child of God. We are precious and loved by the One who is unchanging.

It can be easy to feel lost, worthless, or wanting something tangible for validation of what we're doing or if God is there. God doesn't always give us what we want, but he does give us what we need. We want proof God is here, but forget about the Bible on our shelf or the Communion we received on Sunday. We forget about the Holy Spirit given in our Baptism. In our desire for something "real" we for-

get the one who is really with us. Always.

If we base our identity only on the things of this world, we will never be satisfied. If we seek love only in relationships on this side of heaven, we'll find ourselves

disappointed. Praise be to the One who gives us our identity as His Child. Praise be to the One who saved us from our sins so we may have a restored relationship with God. Praise be to the One who fulfills our needs and always provides for us. Praise be to the One who is "near the broken hearted and saves those crushed in spirit." (Psalm

34:18)
