Concordia Lutheran Preschool January 21st-27th is National Lutheran Schools Week (NLSW). This is the first year we will celebrate it at Concordia. What is NLSW? Well, let's let some experts answer that question:

"National Lutheran Schools Week is a time for connections. Students and classes connect in creative activities. Teachers and administrators intentionally connect with families. Schools and congregations connect in celebrating ministry partnerships. The Lutheran school connects with the local and broader community. School alumni connect with the blessings of the past and support for the future.

The most important connection is with Christ. National Lutheran Schools Week celebrates that Christ is the focus of the Lutheran school not only for a special week, but every day in every activity. This week's textual focus (John 15:1–5) declares that He is "the vine" and only by connecting to Him is there life and fruit.

Connections with Christ are always Trinitarian. The Father sends His only Son as the sacrifice for our sins. The Holy Spirit, promised by the Son, connects us to Him and blesses us with the fruits of faith. The connection between the three persons of the Trinity is emphasized during National Lutheran Schools Week. In the name of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, students, staff and partners celebrate the connection to the church and the commission to grow the kingdom. The Trinitarian emphasis invites a remembrance of the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, where God first connects Himself to us in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit....

The "Connected" theme encourages Lutheran schools to strengthen connections. Jesus promises, "Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). Blessings on a fruitful National Lutheran Schools Week." (2024 National Lutheran Schools Week- Resource Manual page 5)

We're planning to take some small steps to start celebrating NLSW this year. This includes having a special recognition of our Preschool teacher and assistants in church on January 21st.

My family listens to BBN (Bible Broadcast Network) in the car. About a month ago, one of their programs was talking about Ezra. The speaker mentioned how Ezra has trouble, "finding volunteers to handle the sacred." I immediately thought, "We do too!"

There are two different returns to Jerusalem in the book of Ezra. The first return is covered in chapters 1-6 and the second in chapters 7-10 which takes place about 50 years later. In the first return to Jerusalem, 341 Levites (the Temple priests and helpers) return. This seems like a great number, but also consider 42,360 responded to Cyrus's

invitation to return to Judah. It'll be best to let the commentaries explain, "After the lay people have been listed, various classes of temple workers are listed. According to 1 Chronicles 24 David had divided the priesthood into twenty-four orders. It appears that representatives of only four priestly orders returned with Zerubbabel. The Levites were

also rather poorly represented. This poor representation and the special call for temple workers which Ezra issues in Ezra 8:15-17 suggest that the priests and Levites were especially reluctant to leave their new homes in Babylon." (Berg 18 People's Bible Commentary)

In Ezra 8:15-20, in the second return, Ezra discovers there are no Levites among the people. This would be distressing because in order to reform the temple services, he needs Levites. He sends delegations to recruit Levites and God blesses this endeavor. The Lutheran Study Bible says, "The Lord helps Ezra discover the Levites and temple servants whose roles at the temple were going unfulfilled." (LSB 733 Ezra 8:15-20).

In the first Wednesday Advent service, Pastor Henrickson preached on the Parable of the Talents. We all have talents, treasures, or time we can use to serve God and His people here at Concordia. The Church Council, Pastor, or myself don't always know when or where people would like to serve; we do, however, usually have a few things we can think of that need to be done. As Pastor encouraged, take the initiative to say you'd like to help, and we can surely find ways where you could help serve. In reading the commentaries for this article, I came across two beautiful prayers both for those serving in many roles and some serving in a few. Feel free to pray them now. "As then, the Lord gives each of us a role of service in our congregation. The services of

God's house require our faithful support in

word and deed. When you are discouraged or overwhelmed by the needs of your congregation, entrust your cares to the Lord of heaven, who oversees all things for your benefit. He will bless you through the service of Word and Sacrament offered in His name. Dearest Father, grant me joy and contentment in my call-

ing. Help me to see the greater purpose and need of my congregation. Amen." (Lutheran Study Bible 724 Note on Chapter 2)

"Today, each believer has a valuable role of service to fulfill in his or her church, whether leading or attending to other duties. Do not despise anyone's office of service, for any unfulfilled office disrupts the work of all.

Along with your office, the Lord will grant you His Spirit and gifts, which will build you up. Lord, Your Son, Jesus, humbled Himself to serve us. Teach me my role in my congregation and equip me for every good work of my calling. Amen." (Lutheran Study Bible 733 Ezra 8:15-20).

We always need those willing to serve as altar guild, greeting on Sunday morning, choir members, Sunday School teachers, back up office help, people who can fix things, land-scapers, and so much more. One prayer I have for Concordia is that God continues to send us who we need to fulfill the roles He has for His Church.

Fortifying Faith in Those with Vision Impairment — Lutheran Braille Workers — \$100,000

Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) has the opportunity to reach individuals with visual impairment who live in spiritual darkness with the hope and salvation of Jesus Christ. Millions of people around the world are blind or visually impaired. They seek to strengthen their Christian faith while coping with isolation and dealing with physical, mental, and spiritual struggles. They often find it challenging to access Scripture-based reading materials.

This grant will provide LBW the opportunity to produce and add to their library 50 to 100 Scripture-based topical materials in Braille and specialized large print to help meet the spiritual and emotional needs of visually impaired people. Because LBW works with every Christian denomination, these materials

would be available for outreach and evangelism at no cost to those who are blind or visually impaired, regardless of faith or belief.

Church Worker and professional musician Brooke Per-

nice reading a devotional in Braille alongside her guitar. Having been Blind since birth, growing up in the church, and having earned her Master's Degree in church music, Brooke knows firsthand the challenges in finding rich, theologically sound, and Scripturally-based Christian resources in Braille and Large Print. Brooke's face reflects her experience of feeling God's love directly in her heart by reading the Scriptures with her fingertips!
