

- * The theme for our six Wednesday Lenten services will be "The Passion of Our Lord according to Mark," on Mark 14-15, starting on Ash Wednesday, February 14, at 6:30 p.m.
- * We're making available at church, and encouraging everyone to use at home, a devotional aid called "Read Mark: Learn and Inwardly Digest," a reading plan for the Gospel of Mark over the forty days of Lent. This half-sheet has an outline for your personal or family devotion, along with a schedule for reading through all of Mark (the shortest gospel) over the forty days.

My husband's grandfather died in December. Our family attended the wake and funeral. In the weeks after the funeral we received a myriad of questions. They included anything from, "Is he sleeping?" "Was that a statue?"

"Will he come to my birthday?" Needless to say, we've had discussions about death, heaven, and Jesus. One of our kids keeps stating, "He (Jesus) is taking a long time (to come back)."

Yes, He is. I think everyone in the Church would agree. This fallen world is miserable. It's full of sorrow and suffering. We long to be with Jesus; but while we live, we know God still has work for us here. Paul knew this well, "I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account." (Philippians 1:22-

Believers are waiting patiently for Jesus to come again and take us to heaven with him. Believers don't theorize Jesus will come again. We know for a fact and expect His return. God tells us He will come again in His Word. His true and everlasting Word tells us what God will do. In the Garden of Eden, God told us He would send a Savior (Genesis 3:14-15). God did send a Savior. Concordia Lutheran Preschool

February 14th marks the start of the Lenten season and early enrollment for Preschool. Normal registration begins March 1st. Early registration is open for Concordia members and 2023-2024 returning Preschool families. The registration fee for next school year will remain at \$100.

Our classes & costs will be as follows: PreK Monday, Wednesday, Thursday 9am-noon Registration \$125 (paid once) Tuition \$175/month (10 months) PreK students should be 4 by August 1st, 2024 and potty trained

3's Tuesday, Friday 9am-11:30am Registration \$125 (paid once) Tuition \$125/month (10 months) 3's students should be 3 by August 1st, 2024 and potty trained

Once again, any Concordia members or returning families from our 2023-2024 year

may begin registering on February 14th. We ask for prayers on the remainder of our school year, that God would send us the children and families we need for our 2024-2025 year. We also ask that if anyone knows someone looking for a Preschool to recommend our Preschool ministry.

Mite Boxes — How They Began

Perhaps inspired by the various "cent" or "mite" societies of the early 1800s, the Woman's Mission to Woman (Baptist) urged members in its first circular letter in 1871 to use their new Mite Box to raise funds. The entire family was encouraged to contribute. The garnet-colored paper box had an opening on the top and the words "Woman's Mission to Woman" in gold letters on the side.

LWML Mite Boxes

Over the years, many Lutheran Ladies Aid societies used a box to gather funds supporting local and synod ministries. Under the original 1928 Lutheran Women's Missionary Endeavor organizational plan, each woman in every congregation would receive a Mite Box if she participated in the Ladies Aid. Receipts from the 92 Ladies Aid societies totaled \$6,651.31 in 1930.

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League, formally recognized by the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod in 1942, required by the newly adopted constitution and bylaws that 25% of all missionary contributions be sent to the national organization and shared from the districts.

At the 1953 convention, delegates reaffirmed raising funds only through voluntary offerings. Instead of "mite boxes," some societies called their ingathering devices "blessing boxes," "mission boxes," or "thank offering boxes." The first Mite Box design had space for districts to imprint local messages. In publications and speeches, Leaguers were reminded not to tuck their Mite Box away out of sight and then, on the day of the meeting, take out a dollar bill, put it in an envelope, and hand it to the secretary.

Times and Mite Boxes Change

Mite Boxes have changed in color and design over the years, but what has never changed is the dedication of freely given offerings to reach out to others with the Good News of Jesus Christ. Districts still retain 75% of mite offerings for the work of the LWML at that level—National Mites fund over \$1 million in mission grants.

Next month we'll resume profiling Mission Grants from the 2023 Milwaukee Convention.


