Eclipse Event

The total eclipse that takes place on Monday, April 8th will be a once in a hundred year event.



The partial eclipse starts around 1:50pm. The totality of the eclipse takes place around 3:05pm and will last 3-4 minutes. You are welcome to celebrate at Concordia if you would like. You're welcome to bring your own meals, snacks, and drinks. We'll open our parking lot to our congregation members, a Lutheran church from Kentucky, and the public. We will be asking for a free will donation for the parking spot to support our Fellowship Hall remodel. We have free eclipse glasses at Concordia, donated by Festival County Johnson County for those who would like to participate.

We will also have snacks available to purchase that will also support our Fellowship Hall remodel. We've heard traffic will be bad the day of the eclipse, so we recommend carpooling, coming early and leaving late; so be prepared with things to do, extra snacks, and even a full tank of gas!

2023–2025 LWML Mission Grant #8 (Milwaukee Convention) Expanding Gospel Proclamation Worldwide – Concordia Seminary, St. Louis– \$100,000

The LCMS receives frequent requests from other Lutheran church bodies worldwide to share theological knowledge and doctrinally sound practices. Supporting and expanding theological education is one of LCMS's key mission priorities to ensure there will be welleducated pastors to lead these congregations.

Very few of these church bodies have the

resources to send students to the United States for advanced studies, and seminary professors with advanced theological degrees are needed to instruct and mentor pastoral students in their home countries.



God has equipped our seminary professors to fill this gap. International students will come to Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, to complete advanced degrees and return to their country to train pastors who will then shepherd their local churches. This grant will provide aid to international students completing their advanced degrees.

Rev. Aiji Komiyama is a Ph.D. student from Kobe, Japan. A pastor in the West Japan Evangelical Lutheran Church, he earned a Master of Divinity degree from Kobe Lutheran Theological Seminary in 2011 and a Master of Sacred Theology degree from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Ind., in 2020. From 2011-17, he served as pastor of Kita-Suzurandai Lutheran Church (Kita-Suzurandai, Japan). After he earns his Ph.D., he will become a professor at Kobe Lutheran Theological Seminary. Other students come from Ethiopia, Brazil, Ghana, China, and Kenya; many have similar backgrounds. Our mites are supporting the continuing education of these men.

Angel Care, Inc. is dedicated to meeting young women's physical, emotional, and spiritual needs facing a crisis pregnancy and is seeking the construction of a facility to shelter and mentor up to 12 teens through their pregnancy journey.
