I played percussion for a few years in school. I wouldn't say I was good.... When I did auditions to play in college, let's just say the audition didn't go

well.... It wasn't bad; but playing on a new instrument in the audition room didn't go the best. The pieces I played didn't sound like they did in practice. That coupled with a comment along the lines of, "I can tell you have a passion for music, don't you?" made me break out in tears after getting out of the room. Surely he meant, "That's the only nice thing we can say." Eventually, I received a letter welcoming me to the Wind Symphony and I received a small music scholarship! What I didn't know during the audition was Doc Fischer's sincerity. I can never say enough about Doc. God has used Doc to help thousands grow in their faith and musical ability. He honestly shares his faith, struggles, and is kind and loving. Music and Wind Symphony are his ministry. Wind Symphony starts the week with devotions and we played most of our concerts in churches. We always have some sacred pieces in our programs. Every concert had an encore of Who Puts His Trust In God Most Just, which members of Wind Symphony would sing and play. Wind Symphony's joke was, no matter what the audience gets an encore! After concerts; the band would come together and hold hands before clean up to sing the *Doxology*.

Under Doc's direction, the Wind Symphony recorded 13 of their own CDs and is on more with other musical groups from Concordia Chicago. Under Doc's direction, Wind Symphony toured over 40 states and countries like Canada, Eastern Europe, and China. The Wind Symphony has even played in Carnegie Hall. He is the first professor at Concordia Chicago to receive an Endowed Chair.

Doc Fischer has been the head of instru-

mental music at Concordia since 1974. 1974. This is his 50th anniversary at Concordia Chicago. I would guess he has easily shared his faith with over a hundred thousand people in his 50 years. For 50 years he has integrated faith and music. This is an amazing milestone and thankfully, Concordia Chicago is going to celebrate! June 21-23 is reunion weekend.

All of Doc's former musicians are welcome to come back for the reunion and reunion concert to play with him and each other again. This is literally a dream come true for me. I've been in a few bands before. In most of those, we would play some sacred music and even play for church services. Wind Symphony with Doc Fischer is just different. I can't explain why; but if I had to try, it's the faith and caliber of musicians. Doc's faith in Christ as His Savior is interwoven with his ministry through Wind Symphony. I'm sure there are other bands out there like that; however, they don't have Doc. He is so sincere and passionate in talking about faith, music, and seeing the best in people.

The last tour concert and home concert of the year was always heartbreaking. We would say goodbye to the seniors and give them gifts. The Wind Symphony would never be the same again without those people; yet it was always the same. Always rooted in faith. Always beautiful music. Led by Doc. Always a new group of people who would bond together. Thankfully, because of the many years Doc Fischer served at Concordia; I and many others have the chance to play with this group again. I don't care if it's only singing Who Puts His Trust at the end of the concert and the *Doxology* before clean up. Just being part of this group again is a special moment. I am excited to celebrate Doc and his ministry. I'm excited to be part of this ministry again; even for a few days. Even if it is only for those two songs.

I think it's because this is what my picture of heaven is like. People from Doc's 50 years of ministry will be there. I know Doc's faith will be central to this program and to many of the people there. This reunion will bring people back together from many different school years and places from the United States, possibly the world. All to celebrate this one person and his faith and ministry. One day, we'll all praise God through music and song. One day; Jesus will return and bring together people of all times, places who are scattered throughout the world. He will take

all who believe in Him as their Savior to heaven where we will be united under one Lord, one faith, and one birth. We will praise God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost. Not just for one weekend; but for all eternity. We may stand hand in hand with people we know or people we don't; but on that day, it won't matter. All that will matter is praising God from whom all blessings flow.

### Upheld by God's Hand, Mental Health Outreach LCMS Life Ministry — \$96,500

Millions of people in the United States are suffering from mental illness and disorders. There is a tremendous need and opportunity for Lutheran outreach to help these people and their family members cope with mental illnesses.

Research validates that people seeking help for mental disorders might be more likely to consult a pastor than a clinical therapist or psychologist. Pastors, church workers, and lay leaders must be prepared to address the mental health and illness issues that members of the congregation and those outside the Church may bring to them.

The LCMS Task Force for Mental Illness, Health, and Wellness is coordinating with LCMS Life Ministry to develop and publish materials and resources to train church workers and lay leaders about mental health outreach and spiritual care. This grant will support the development of these materials

### Equipping Young Leaders LCMS Youth Ministry — \$50,000

LCMS Youth Ministry faithfully leads, serves, and provides resources and networks with youth and adults working through LCMS districts

and congregations, with Christ and His gifts at the heart and center of everything. The sponsored Youth Lead program and Servant Events are designed to train young leaders and give them service opportunities. Offering Youth Lead conferences regionally, piloting a new format of Servant Events to include leadership training, and increasing curriculums will provide service and leadership training to more teens and young adults. LCMS Youth Ministries wants to deepen its understanding of young people's needs and the best practices for youth and young adult ministry. Survey results show that the way to keep young people connected to the Church is to give them chances to serve and lead. This grant will allow LCMS Youth Ministry to expand its programs to equip young leaders.

Set Apart to Serve is a Synod-wide initiative that focuses on forming and recruiting full-time church workers to teach the saving faith to God's people. Since Christ provides workers for His Church through His people, every congregation needs to talk intentionally to our youth and adults about church work to stimulate enrollment in Christian education, deaconess, parish music director, family life, and seminary programs.

This grant will partially fund anticipated expenses of a broad, rigorously planned, well-constructed, multi-year sustained effort across the LCMS to affect a positive, cultural change in how church worker vocations are perceived. Prospective students will be encouraged and inspired to consider and prepare to serve the Church in lifelong professions that advance the Gospel in the U.S. and abroad.




Bibles in the pews. Thank you for encouraging the children of our congregation to read the word of God. Thank you for also supporting parents with some-


