Christ Jesus Is the One and Only Good by Whom You Inherit Eternal Life

The Lord is the Author and Giver of life, as well as a consuming fire of judgment against all "who afflict the righteous, who take a bribe, and turn aside the needy in the gate" (Amos 5:12). "Seek the Lord and live," therefore, by hating what is evil, loving what is good and doing what is just and right, according to His Word. "And so the Lord, the God of hosts, will be with you" (Amos 5:6, 14-15). Understand that "no one is good except God alone" (Mark 10:18). Sharing Christ with Women and Children in Kazakhstan

Lutheran Hour Ministries — \$100,000

Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM)'s mission, based on the clear teaching of Scripture, is to bring Christ to the Nations and the Nations to the Church. The established LHM ministry center in Kazakhstan carries out Gospel outreach to a non-Christian country where many people face hardships and have limited opportunities to hear the Gospel.

LHM has identified opportunities to reach out and share the Good News with women and their families in urban areas and remote villages. Effective outreach methods have included Christian training programs, resources, and media that allow them to share the love of Jesus. Outreach through media and Christian discipleship materials will enable families to hear God's message of salvation in culturally appropriate ways.

This grant will support the powerful Christian witness of love to strengthen relationships, provide encouragement, and build faith in Jesus.

Lutheran Hour Ministries-Kazakhstan staff and volunteers distribute food packages to families living in extreme poverty in remote villages and share the love of Jesus.

Expanding Gospel Outreach to Hispanics in the U.S.

Lutheran Hour Ministries - \$100,000

Hispanics have become the second-largest ethnic population in the United States. Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) realizes there are many opportunities to share the Gospel using Christian resources available through media and outreach technology.

LHM is not simply translating English materials into Spanish; it is crafting programming, media content, and written materials for Hispanics by Hispanics. These apply to daily life in American culture and help spread the Gospel. Working with LCMS ministry leaders, churches, districts, universities, and seminaries, LHM has reached out to more of the Hispanic population.

Lutheran World Relief
