Jesus Came for Gentiles, Too

The Gospel of Christ is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Gentile (Rom. 1:8-17). Even in the Old Testament, the Gentiles were beneficiaries of God's saving power. Though unimpressed at first with the Word of God, a Syrian commander is persuaded to receive that Word, and in the water he is cleansed and brought to faith in the God of Israel (2 Kings 5:1-15a). Evil is overcome by good (Rom 12:16–21). So also in the New Testament, a Roman centurion demonstrates great and humble faith in the Lord (Matt. 8:1-13). All he needs is the Word of Christ, for he trusts that Jesus' Word of healing has authority to accomplish what it says. And indeed it does. The centurion's faith is praised by our Lord above that of any Israelite. For the last shall be first, and the first last. Apart from faith in Christ, there is no salvation—not even for a Jew-but only weeping and gnashing of teeth.

In February, one of the things we celebrate is Valentine's Day. There are lots of legends and stories surrounding St. Valentine, but people tend to focus on love for that day. Love is such a tricky word in the English language. Parents and children say they love each other. When people get married, they say they love each other. Some people love ice cream or tacos. Others love their parents or siblings. But, in all those situations I would say, "I love ______." Unfortunately, we don't have many other words to say we love something.

In the Greek language, there are multiple words for love. Someone may talk about philia the affection or friendship between family members or friends. (Philadelphia the city of brotherly love.) Storge is the love or bond between parents and children. Eros is a romantic love. (Cupid/Eros was considered the Roman/Greek god of love/desire/attraction). There are more words for love, but probably the most important one for us to know is agape.

In the Christian context it is a deep and unconditional love. It's the sacrificial love God has for his people. This is the love that drove Jesus to take on human flesh and to dwell among us. Without God's love, we would be lost and wandering in darkness and lawlessness. "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8) God loves us so much that He sent Jesus as the propitiation (atonement/appeasement) of our sins. God took away our sins so we could live with him in heaven one day. Because of God's great love for us, we can respond to that love in joy and with love as well. Jesus sacrificed himself for us. Now we can show others Jesus's sacrificial love.

We can serve our neighbors in their spiritual, physical, and emotional needs. We can share God's True Word with all people. Is there any greater love than that? We can also help care for our neighbors with any other needs they have on this earth. We can only share this love because God first loved us.

While the world celebrates an earthly love this month; let us focus, as always, on the things of Christ. Let us remember God's good gifts to us. Let's remember the salvation He brings to all people. Let us share that love with all people so that all may believe in Christ as their Savior and have life in His name.

A Legacy of Love for Special Needs Children

— Lutheran Special Education Ministries, U.S. — \$100,000

One in five children in the United States has a learning need. Each child is unique; they all learn at a different pace, and some require different approaches to learning. Parents often must make the choice between a public school that addresses their learning needs or a Christian education that develops their spirituality.

Lutheran Special Education Ministries (LSEM) serves schools, churches, and families to advance the success of children with learning needs by providing resources to benefit them in the classroom and their church communities. They have served God's children with special needs for 150 years.

This grant will allow LSEM to continue developing and researching tools and techniques to provide resources to Lutheran churches to welcome, integrate, and support children with specialized needs and their families in their church bodies.



In 2023, Lutheran Special Education Ministries celebrated 150 years of serving God's children with special needs. They have a rich and full history, which began as an orphanage for children after the Civil War, turned into a Lutheran School for the Deaf, and has grown into Lutheran Special Education Ministries, now serving children with all kinds of learning needs across the country and internationally.

Hope for the Destitute and Caring for Orphaned and Vulnerable Children in Kismu Kenya - \$12,000

The Caring for Orphans and Vulnerable Children project currently has over 150 children who are cared for spiritually, educationally, and medically. Many of our children are so excited to learn and grow in the word of God that they are willing to walk miles to attend our school and are often exhausted in the morning before school. We bought a school van to help transport students to and from school. However, as the number of students increases, we need a second larger bus to help transport students. The van is also used upon request on Sundays to transport the elderly members of the community to attend our Lutheran Sunday worship.


