Jesus Does Battle in Our Place

In the Garden, man exalts himself to be a god in place of God (Gen. 3:1-21). He succumbs to the temptation of the devil, and eating of the forbidden fruit, he receives death. But in the sin-cursed wilderness, God humbles Himself to become man in place of man (Mt. 4:1-11). He does not eat but fasts and bears the onslaughts of the devil for us that we may be restored to life. Jesus stands as David in our place to do battle against the Goliath, Satan (1 Samuel 17:40-51). Though outwardly Jesus appears weak, yet He comes in the name of the Lord of hosts. He draws from the five smooth stones of the books of Moses and slings the Word of God. The stone sinks into the forehead, and the enemy falls. In Christ we are victorious over the devil. Let us therefore not receive the grace of God in vain (2 Cor. 6:1-10), but seeing that we have a great High Priest, let us come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain help in time of need (Heb 4:14-16).

I hope to eventually finish them. Both come highly recommended from different friends. The first one is called *The Anxious Generation* and the second is called *Habits of the Household*. With Lent coming up, my favorite tradition tends to be picking something up for Lent, not necessarily giving something up. This year, I think I'll do something different. After reading only the first few chapters of these books I think it's interesting how screens can be linked to both anxiety and how it can dictate what happens in our house.

I know I've been caught more than once (possibly every night) scrolling social media, caught on Youtube, going through Pinterest, or scanning new recipes. As *Habits of the Household* points out, the scroll is endless. We'll keep looking and never find the end. It's so easy to want to keep searching for that one more thing or to see what's next. But it's true. There is so much information out there. A lot of it is repeated, some of it is false, but it is truly endless in a way. There is at least so much we can't fathom where it would end.

It's so easy to fall into those traps. It's a lot harder to fall into good habits. It's a lot harder to consciously seek out God and His Word. Knowing how endless being stuck on a screen can be, we can think about how truly endless God is. How whenever we seek God, we will always find something beneficial. I find it harder to desire to read God and His Word. It's so much easier to just flick your thumb for one more video without thinking about it. I find it harder to want to read one more verse.

When we seek God with our whole heart, we will find him. God doesn't hide from us. He tells us He is found in His Word and Sacrament. We find him in the Bible, Baptisms, and the Lord's Supper. We find His forgiveness proclaimed by pastor at church. God gives us the gift of the Holy Spirit in our baptism. God always hears our prayers. We should be surrounded by God (and we are if we really pay attention). We should be in the habit of praying, attending church, reading our Bible and other beneficial things. If I'm going to lose sleep, it shouldn't be over mindlessly scrolling on my phone, it should be on seeking God in Word or prayer.

I pray that we all have a blessed Lenten season. For some of us, it's taking on a new habit that may be beneficial to our faith life. For others, it will be to give something up in remembrance of Christ giving His life for us. But in this season and every season, may we intentionally seek God in all we do.

God's Word for Central and South American Missions

- Lutheran Heritage Foundation - \$100,000

In countries like the Dominican Republic, Chile, and Uruguay, efforts are underway to intensify Lutheran evangelism efforts. The need for Spanish language Bibles, Luther's Small Catechism, children's materials, devotions, and other resources is continuous. New pastors trained to be missionaries and evangelists need materials that help share the Good News.

This grant will provide the translation and printing costs of approximately 25,000 books by the Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF). LHF will distribute the printed books free of charge to people in Central and South America who live from week to week and have little to no savings. Even though economic or political conditions may force missionaries to come and go in these countries, they leave behind the Lutheran books which continue to teach for generations.



For many children in poverty-stricken areas of Peru, Guatemala, Venezuela, and Mexico, LHF's Spanish translation of the children's Bible, A Child's Garden of Bible Stories, is their only book. Missionaries share the Bible books at after-school and weekend programs that help bring the kids off the dangerous city streets.
