The Resurrection of Our Lord

Christ's Resurrection Means That We Will One Day Be Raised "Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed" (1 Cor. 5:7). By the shed blood of Christ, the Lamb of God, eternal death has passed over us. Now we pass with Christ through death into life everlasting. For Christ the crucified One is risen! The stone has been rolled away from the tomb, revealing that the tomb could not hold Him (Mark 16:1-8). Now our Redeemer lives eternally to save us from sin and Satan and the grave, and we can live in the sure hope of our own bodily resurrection with Christ. "After my skin has been thus destroyed, yet in my flesh I shall see God" (Job 19:26). Feasting on the living Christ, who is our meat and drink indeed, we boldly say: "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting? . . . But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 15:54-55, 57).

Here we are at another awkward time. We're still in Lent, Easter is late, we have a congregational meeting probably before this is printed. We're still learning patience, waiting on a pastor. What should this newsletter be about?

Usually, I like writing about the song *I Know that My Redeemer Lives* around Easter. But I'm not "feeling" that "Easter joy." I was looking through the Easter hymns in the hymnal for inspiration. Go look, there are so many beautiful ones! Yet none of them matched my anxious mood.

I looked at the trust section of the hymnal and found hymn 719 *I Leave All Things to God's Direction*. That's it. That's how I feel. There are so many things going on and I have no control. We're trusting God will give us a pastor. We're praying for Pastor Fangmeyer's health. There are many things going on in the lives of the people at Concordia. This hymn shares the trust I strive to have.

"I leave all things to God's direction; He loves me both in joy and woe. His will is good, sure His affection; His tender love is true, I know. My fortress and my rock is He: What pleases God, that pleases me. God knows what must be done to save me; His love for me will never cease. Upon His hands He did engrave me With purest gold of loving grace. His will supreme must ever be: What please God, that pleases me. My God desires the soul's salvation; My soul He, too, desires to save. Therefore with Christian resignation All earthly troubles I will brave. His will be done eternally; What pleases God, that pleases me. My God has all things in His keeping; He is the ever faithful friend. He gives me laughter after weeping, And all His ways in blessing end. His love endures eternally: What pleases God pleases me."

Romans 8:26-28 shares, "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose." The Lutheran Study Bible notes on page 1925, "The Holy Spirit ministers to God's dear children by giving us hope in our suffering, help in our weakness, and assurance that all things work out to fulfill God's eternal purposes in our lives. When our hope in God dims, we easily succumb to impatience in distress. The Spirit helps us in our frailty, assuring us of God's steadfast love."

We can trust that God loves the people we love more than we ever can. He will continue to provide for us all in body and soul through life everlasting.

Showering Love on the Least of These — Mercy Holistic Ministry, CA — \$100,000

Mercy Holistic Ministry (MHM) is a Sacramento, California, organization established in 2010. It provides dignified holistic services to restore and transform the lives of the homeless community in and around the city. Its ministry partners include various area LCMS congregations.

In 2021, MHM purchased a two-stall shower trailer, literally bringing showers and the Gospel to the homeless's location. Beyond showers, MHM provides personal hygiene kits, haircuts, clean clothing, and food to those who come. They also offer the opportunity to speak with someone who can pray for them, provide active listening, and give referrals to other services, such as shelters. Bibles and prayer books are also shared.

This grant will enable MHM to offer an additional day of service per week and purchase and retrofit a mobile closet trailer to store clean clothing and hygiene kits.



After a refreshing hot shower offered by Mercy Holistic Ministry (MHM) in their mobile shower truck in downtown Sacramento, sometimes the first shower in months! MHM also provides personal hygiene kits and clothing, as well as a shower.



Shaun, a formerly homeless employee of MHM who is now married and housed, provides haircut services at the shower site. Shelters or other programs typically do not provide haircuts.
