OLD TESTAMENT READING

1 Samuel 16:1–13

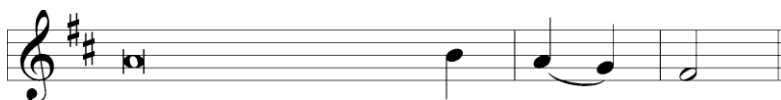
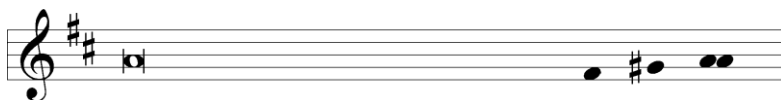

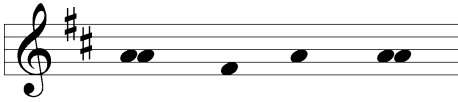
