Easter Homily

by John Chrysostom (AD 347-407)

Is there anyone who is a devout lover of God?
Let them enjoy this beautiful bright festival!
Is there anyone who is a grateful servant?
Let them rejoice and enter into the joy of their Lord!

Are there any weary with fasting?
Let them now receive their wages!
If any have toiled from the first hour,
let them receive their due reward;
If any have come after the third hour,
let him with gratitude join in the Feast!
And he that arrived after the sixth hour,
let him not doubt; for he too shall sustain no loss.
And if any delayed until the ninth hour,
let him not hesitate; but let him come too.
And he who arrived only at the eleventh hour,
let him not be afraid by reason of his delay.

For the Lord is gracious and receives the last even as
the first.
He gives rest to him that comes at the eleventh hour,
as well as to him that toiled from the first.
To this one He gives, and upon another He bestows.
He accepts the works as He greets the endeavor.
The deed He honors and the intention He commends.

Let us all enter into the joy of the Lord!
First and last alike receive your reward;
rich and poor, rejoice together!
Sober and slothful, celebrate the day!

You that have kept the fast, and you that have not,

I've been reading a lot about loving prodigals to prepare for women's Bible Study. Some of the commentaries I read on Luke 15 focus on the loving father and not the prodigal son. They focus on the father being the main character of the parable and not the son.

In some of the more practical books I've been reading for this study, they also focus on love and forgiveness. Often prodigals and their families hurt each other in some way or another. Often it's decisions made or things said (or not said). Rarely is it completely one sided and rarely is there a specific point in time that is the complete turning point in one's life toward prodigalhood. As much as some want to blame and point to one specific time, it's usually a culmination of decisions that brings everyone to the point of being a prodigal or parent of a prodigal.

One major theme the books talk about is forgiveness. Needing to forgive the prodigal; but also let them face brokenness and consequences for their actions. Also, prodigals need to forgive their parents. One of the books I read by Phil Waldrep interviews 30 prodigals (spiritual and from other poor decision making). One of the stories talks about how a rift continued to grow between a father and son. The father believed if there was something truly wrong, the son would say something. Finally, the father took the first step. When he found out why the son was angry; the father didn't defend himself (even though there was an important reason why it happened), he asked for forgiveness. The son forgave him and their relationship began to mend.

We choose to sin a lot either intentionally or by habit. How often do we drive a rift between our Savior and ourselves. Thankfully, God has already bridged the rift. However, we still need to recognize our sin and return to our loving Father as well. While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Christ already took the first step. Christ took our punishment for us. In our sin and brokenness, we recognize our need for a Savior. When we finally realize how unclean we are and how far we're separated from God; we truly recognize our need for forgiveness and a Savior. Sometimes we believe God could never love or forgive us; but NOTHING in all creation can separate us from our loving Father.

Thank God Jesus washes us clean through His death and resurrection. Thank God He loved us enough to help us return home. Our loving Father loves us more than we will ever realize.

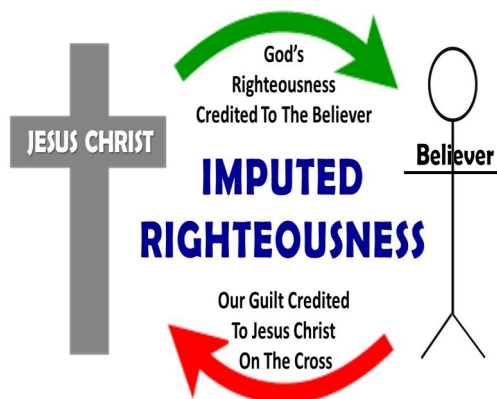
